Presentation Guidelines and Rubric

You will present your posters in class on either December 7th or 9th. Each group will share their project with the class. Presentations should be between 15-30 minutes, with another 5-10 minutes for open Q and A.

You have flexibility in precisely how you present your project, but make sure your presentation includes the following:

- A general overview of your community partner (who your partner is, what populations your partner serves, etc.), and the task you were working on
- Any science that was important for understanding the project
- Any ethical considerations that were important for understanding the project
- A visual aid (e.g. PowerPoint, handout)
- If relevant, examples and illustrations to help the class understand the project
- An overview of your finished product: what did you ultimately produce?

Presentations will be graded as a group, using the following rubric:

- <u>19-20 pts</u>: Presentation clearly communicates the project and offers thoughtful responses to questions during Q & A.
- <u>17-18 pts</u>: Presentation communicates the project and offers thoughtful responses during the Q & A, but does so less effectively than presentations in the 19-20 point range
- <u>15-16 pts</u>: Presentation either does not clearly communicate the project effectively, and/or does not offer thoughtful responses during the Q & A.
- 14 pts and below: presentation fails to meet the general expectations of the assignment.
